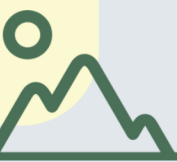

'Lead Small' Principles

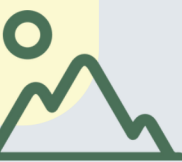
- Respect the Process
 - takes time to build trust
 - it's okay to say "I don't know" to a question and look into it together
 - pray for your students
- Be Present
 - Show up predictably, mentally and unexpectedly
- Create a Safe Place
 - Lead the group with: acceptance, confidentiality, honesty, guard the heart





Principles Cont...

- Partner with the Family
 - Cue them, Honor them, Reinforce the Family
- Make it Personal
 - lead by example through: living in community, setting priorities, be genuine
- Move them Out
 - get them connected with other leaders, serving in the church, and to future leadership steps
